## **State Representative Jay Goyal Named to Nation-Wide 40 Under 40 List New Leaders Council Recognizes Legislator's Many Achievements**



State Representative Jay Goyal was selected as one of the nation's top 40 community leaders by [The New Leaders Council \(NLC\)](#). NLC is a national organization focusing on leadership development. Their '40 Under 40' list recognizes the dedication and effort of leaders such as elected officials, inspiring community organizers and non-profit and policy leaders who use their resources to strengthen their neighborhoods and support their communities.

"It is quite the honor to be chosen for this award," said Rep. Goyal. "I hope the council will be successful here in Columbus and will continue to honor those working to improve their local communities."

During his tenure in the state legislature, Rep. Goyal has fought for the establishment of a small businesses working capital loan program as well as the expansion and renewal of Ohio's Third Frontier program, which provides vital support to Ohio's knowledge-based economy. Rep. Goyal also worked to encourage investment in new companies across the state through Ohio's Venture Capital Fund.

Adam Borelli, the Executive Director of New Leaders states, "[Goyal] is certainly a young leader and a rising star. He has accomplished a lot in the little amount of time he has been in office and this can certainly be attributed to his ability of working across party lines."

## **St. Rep. Goyal Acknowledged in Wall Street Journal**
